> TEXT

Psalm 119:113–120 KJV 1900 ¹¹³ SAMECH.

I hate vain thoughts:

But thy law do I love.

¹¹⁴ Thou *art* my hiding place and my shield:

I hope in thy word.

¹¹⁵ Depart from me, ye evildoers:

For I will keep the commandments of my God.

¹¹⁶ Uphold me according unto thy word, that I may live:

And let me not be ashamed of my hope.

¹¹⁷ Hold thou me up, and I shall be safe:

And I will have respect unto thy statutes continually.

¹¹⁸ Thou hast trodden down all them that err from thy statutes:

For their deceit *is* falsehood.

¹¹⁹ Thou puttest away all the wicked of the earth *like* dross:

Therefore I love thy testimonies.

¹²⁰ My flesh trembleth for fear of thee;

And I am afraid of thy judgments.

> SUMMARY

Scriptural realities for why we commit to Jesus:

- 1. We fear His judgments
- 2. We hope for His grace, blessings, and promises
- 3. We love His path, person, and precepts

This seems to be a sequential process, though not absolute.

Why do you commit to Jesus?

> INTRO

It's a good idea to ask yourself: Why?

We have been talking about the cost and frequency of committing to Jesus.

Today, I want to consider three reason why you might commit to Jesus.

> MESSAGE

Why do we commit to Jesus?

#1 We fear His judgments.

Jonah: eventual obeyed out of fear but nothing more than that.

#2 We hope for His <u>grace</u>, <u>blessings</u>, and <u>promises</u>.

Grace: thief on the cross Blessings: crowds that followed Jesus; Judas Promises: Paul in hope of rewards at the Judgement seat

#3 We love His <u>path</u>, <u>Person</u>, and <u>precepts</u>.

Path: 11 Disciples

Person: Peter, James, and John

John 6:66–69 KJV 1900

⁶⁶ From that *time* many of his disciples went back, and walked no more with him. ⁶⁷ Then said Jesus unto the twelve, Will ye also go away? ⁶⁸ Then Simon Peter answered him, Lord, to whom shall we go? thou hast the words of eternal life. ⁶⁹ And we believe and are sure that thou art that Christ, the Son of the living God.

Precepts: David, though he did not always follow them, loved God's ways.

> CONCLUSION

Why do you commit to Jesus?

Even if is because you fear His judgments, you must know He loves you.

Ultimately, we learn to love Jesus because of His love for us.
